

Alexander C. Schoch is the General Counsel of the Railroad Commission of Texas, based in Austin TX. He is responsible for the General Law and Enforcement Sections of the Commission's Office of General Counsel. The Commission has regulated the oil and gas industry in Texas for over 100 years. The Commission also regulates natural gas utilities, surface mining and intrastate pipelines, but no longer has any jurisdiction over railroads.

Mr. Schoch has extensive corporate legal experience. Prior to joining the Commission in 2016, Mr. Schoch was Executive Vice President, Chief Legal Officer & Secretary of Peabody Energy Corporation. In that position he advised the Board of Directors and Executive Management regarding the company's worldwide operations, and was responsible for global legal, compliance and governance functions.

Mr. Schoch previously served as Vice President and General Counsel for Emerson Process Management. He also served as Vice President, Associate General Counsel & Secretary of Goodrich Corporation until 2004, with prior assignments in Goodrich's aerospace and specialty chemicals divisions. Mr. Schoch also worked for Marathon Oil Company as an attorney supporting its domestic and international exploration and production operations. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics from Kenyon College and his Juris Doctor degree from Case Western Reserve University.

Mr. Schoch was elected a member of the American Law Institute in 2015, and is a member of the Board of Advisors for the Texas Journal of Oil, Gas, and Energy Law. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of the National Blues Museum in St. Louis, MO and the Texas Advocacy Project in Austin TX.
